Welcome to all Toybox Families,

We are nearly half way through the year if you can believe that!

Some housekeeping for all families attending the centre.

Could families be mindful of shutting doors behind them carefully, we have some children that like to roam if doors are open. If you have other siblings that come into the building at drop off and pick up times, please be mindful that they are under your supervision whilst in the centre at all times, they should not be opening doors or gates around smaller children.

A reminder about Maternity Leave, if you are on Maternity Leave you will be required to drop back to one day a week, unless we have a particular need for a certain day, it will be your choice which day you keep. On return from Maternity Leave your child's original booked days will be reinstated. You may book casual days whilst on Maternity Leave providing we have openings. Be mindful of your Subsidy allowances as this may change whilst you are on Mat Leave, individual circumstances will be different, you may need to contact Centrelink for clarification.

And just a quick note on vacancies.

We have an extensive wait list for not only currently attending children wanting extra days or to swap days, or siblings waiting to get in, but new families trying to access care for the first time. Our wait time is approximately 2 years, we do our best to accommodate families, but this is not always possible. It is strongly recommended to have a back up plan for care, as unavailability of bookings may cause distress to families.

### Admin Updates: Some EOFY reminders,

Most families confirmed their **2019–20** income before the first deadline on 30 June 2021. Families who haven't confirmed their 2019–20 income must do so by 30 June 2022. If they don't, they may need to pay back all the CCS they got for 2019–20. They will also lose their CCS and Additional Child Care Subsidy (ACCS) eligibility from the first CCS fortnight of the 2022–23 financial year. **2020–21 financial year**, All families must confirm their 2020–21 income before the first deadline on 30 June 2022. If they don't, their **CCS WILL STOP**. This means they'll need to pay full fees when they use child care. Please go to your myGov account to do this.

**July School Holidays** are fast approaching please organise your holding fees or extra care required by 24th June.

Any children starting Kindy at Navigators or St Joes for the Term 3 takeup, can you please let me know if you need to cancel care or drop days, 2 weeks notice is required for cancellation of care.

### **Correspondence App**

**PRE-KINDY** Wow! It's the first half of the year already. Time flies when you're having fun. Welcome Chris, Brie and Rach to the Pre-Kindy room. We are doing lots of fun activities and experiences that we are excited to share with you in the Pre-Kindy room.

In our Science area, we had been growing different vegetable seeds for our garden and created a snail habitat and animal bones display. We had lots of curious minds so we always love science experiments like mixing colours, making potions or perfumes and exploring our senses.

Everyone in the room loves dressing up, building and playing with dolls. A few of the children have been interested in animals, shopkeepers and camping so we created an Ice cream shop, campground and a Vet clinic, it was a popular pretend play.

We also participated in real-life experiences like making scones and biscuits. Our Pre-K's are always full of energy so we spent a lot of time outdoors engaged in physical

**KINDY ROOM** -I would like to welcome Mya, as new member of the team in the Kindy Room, joining Barbie (ECT), Chris and Cheyanne.

The theme in the Kindy Room is Space and the children have been learning about the names of the planets, facts about space, sharing their knowledge about space, and using their fine motor skills to make artwork and displays in the room. Our favourite space books are called "The Dinosaur that Pooped a Planet", and "Life on Mars".

The children are keen to learn about space and we will continue to learn and build our knowledge about the planets in our solar system, the moon landing, patterns in our night sky – the stars, life on our planet, the cultural significance of stars to the Indigenous Australians – the Aboriginal and Torres Strait people, space themed Yoga, and conducting science experiments that are space themed, such as launching a rocket.

We have introduced sign language to our morning roll call routine, by using our hands to sign Good Morning, to be inclusive to all children in the Kindy Room. Our morning routine also involves the children singing and clicking along to the "Days of the Week" song to the tune of the Addams Family and changing our daily calendar and weather chart. We have been promoting working together in small groups, being a good listener, being a good friend, making good play choices, using good manners, using good hygiene practices, being respectful of our classroom environment, and we have been revisiting our classroom rules and expectations.
